

The AAM Mentoring Program is designed to foster and inspire mentoring relationships that will offer support and guidance to church musicians who are interested in developing their resources and skills, particularly those musicians new to the Episcopal Church.



Each "mentee" will work with an experienced colleague: a mentor. The mentor will help the mentee assess his or her skills and special abilities, offering help in locating resources, and providing support and guidance

in matters such as hymn and service playing, choral conducting, accompanying, liturgical planning and repertoire, staff relations, and the development of listening skills.



HOW THE MENTORING PROGRAM WORKS


Persons desiring guidance are encouraged to email Kyle Ritter, Chair of the AAM Mentoring Committee. After an initial conversation in which the needs of the mentee are assessed, a mentor is selected by the committee and introduced to the mentee. The mentor is a seasoned colleague who ideally lives in the same or a nearby geographic location—someone who can
